Interim Language Key

The Interim Language Key offers the abbreviations and shorthand used whilst following and mapping teacher students (conceptualized as becoming-teachers (BT)) in school settings. The language here used is therefore modulated in keeping with Deleuzian ontology when referenced in finished texts.

Symbol:	Meaning:
TS	Teacher student (in finished texts: becoming-teacher (BT)).
A-Ö	All teacher students have been assigned a random letter as a pseudonym.
P1	Pupil (in finished texts: <i>child</i>). When there is more than one pupil involved in the reported activity, the letter receives a digit after the uppercase P (P1, P2, P3). NOTE! In most cases the digit is not tied to a specific pupil during a session, just in the ongoing activity – unless the class has five pupils or less.
Sup.	Supervisor.
T1	Teacher. The teacher keeps the same digit during the entire workday.
CA1	Classroom assistant. Digits are added in keeping with the logic described for the category 'pupils'.
SP	Special Pedagogue.
Co.	Colleague. Sometimes used when there is an uncertainty regarding the function of said body. Often in keeping with brief interactions, such as encounters taking place in corridors.

//text//	Reflection.
